Academic Orientation Programme

At GIIS, we believe that good communication between school and the home is essential. Orientation programmes are one such effective communicative strategy of our school which includes presentations and workshops for parents to nurture trust, confidence, respect and the desire to learn.

Orientation for KG class parents:

On the 7th of April, GIIS-KL Kindergarten Department opened its doors to the new batch of KG 1 students. An astounding number of 40 children joined us this year in KG 1, while many new children joined in KG 2.



A Parent Orientation was held on the 3rd of May 2015 (Saturday) to welcome the new parents to the GIIS Family. The session also served to brief the new members about the day to day norms as well as to present an outline of what their children will learn in the Montessori Plus Programme. The Kindergarten Coordinator Ms. K.

Kalah Kulasingam thanked the parents for making the GIIS Kindergarten as their choice for their children's education and explained that the GIIS Montessori Plus is unique that compares to none.

Orientation for class 1-3 parents:

Parent Orientation was conducted on 9th May, 2015 at the GIIS School Auditorium in two batches. Ms Muthu lakshmi and Ms Bhuvana introduced the subject teachers and took the parents through a power-point presentation to apprise them of the methodology, evaluation pattern and school rules.



All dimensions of scholastic and co-scholastic areas were significantly explained.

Orientation for class 6, 9 & 10 parents:

Parent Orientation for class 9 & 10 was held on the 18th of April and for class 6 on the 30th of May to brief the parents about the rules and regulations laid by CBSE-I in evaluation. The session covered how in CCE (Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation), students must focus on their best performance throughout the year in Formative & Summative Assessments.

My Financial Life -Financial Literacy Awareness Workshop:

Under the aegis of the Global Parenting Forum, an Interactive Talk on 'My Financial Life', was organised by GIIS and MoneyTree for parents on Saturday, 18th April 2015 from 10.00 to 11.00 am at the School Auditorium.

With the help of the Speaker, Ms Linnet Lee, CEO of Financial Planning Association of Malaysia (FPAM), the audience were able to see the connectivity between one area of their life with



another and the importance of planning it well. For younger audience, she shared her thoughts about money and its effect on their lives now and when they start working. It also highlighted how to work with the different types of financial intermediaries and questions that may have to be cleared before engaging their services.

Workshop on Phonics for Kindergarten parents (16th May):

The Kindergarten Team conducted a Phonics Workshop on the 16th of May 2015 for parents to help them understand the methodology used in the class.

This session was planned to cultivate a three- way partnership between Parent – Child – Teacher. It was emphasized that parents too play an important role in reinforcing what the child has learnt in school. This interactive session concluded with the distribution of handouts with information on the phonics system to the parents.

GIIS-KL Health Talk:



The Kindergarten Department was happy to organize a Health Talk for the Kindergarten Parents on the 16th May 2015. The talk was given by Dr. Ronald Ujjal Leo.

Dr. Ronald spoke about the different causes of childhood illnesses and the symptoms too. It was followed by a Question and Answer session where parents participated very enthusiastically.

GIIS KL SCIENCE WEEK:

Science helps us to satisfy the natural curiosity with which we are all born. It helps us to learn about important topics such as our health, the environment, as well as natural phenomenon that occur on our planet.



GIIS, KL in collaboration with ENTECRES Labs dedicated 20th-24th April to celebrate science week and the objective was: "Getting children to be curious about the world around them and applying the principles of science around them in their everyday life."



The week kick- started with an assembly where children modeled as toothpaste, automobiles, satellites etc. to elucidate the importance of science in everyday life. During the week- long class room activities, a unique platform was provided to students to learn more about the different forces like frictional forces, applied forces, air resistant forces and about water purification process by using carbon blocks, sand and pebbles. The 'Little Scientists' of Primary (CBSE I & Cambridge), learnt about the nutritional facts in the food they eat and about awareness on what surrounds them.

World Earth Day, on 22nd April, was observed by children from lower classes learning how to reduce the threat to the environment by segregating bio-degradable & non-biodegradable products and waste material. A talk based on use of Nano technology in our everyday life was arranged for secondary students. Children were surprised to know that the sunscreen they use, the tablets they take, all contains Nano materials. The speaker Ms. Sadia Afreen was a Research student from University of Nottingham.



Blending Science with engineering, GIIS students displayed creativity and resilience of thought while coming up with useful designs. Primary students built models like see-saw (inclined plane) and structures that can hold weights with the usage of ice cream sticks while secondary students built a solar oven, a sail boat to study the concept of air resistance and built a suspension bridge by using recycled material. Grade 11& 12 students designed and launched a model rocket by applying the scientific concept of hydraulic pressure which was witnessed by all students excitedly.

On the Finale, parents showed eagerness to test their knowledge and application of scientific principles by participating enthusiastically in activities like Robot Race, Magnet Race & Quiz. Ms. Kalyani, Head of Science Department presented a report on 'Science Around Us' which highlighted the learning outcomes, followed by an Award Ceremony for students and parents who were winners of the activities conducted during the week.

Overall, the Science week was successful in bringing to the fore the potential abilities of students and encouraging them to explore the different aspects of science around them.

GIIS KL MATH WEEK:



Mathematics is the abstract key which turns the lock of the physical universe!

GIIS, KL dedicated 25th-29th May to celebrate Mathematics and the objective of this Math week is: "Make children overcome the fear of Math and present Math as interesting, challenging and rewarding subject."

The week long class room activities were planned to encourage students across all levels to work harder at Math but still have fun in performing those activities. The various activities like Math Maze, Coordinate Geometry, Tangrams/Sudoku, Math Trail, Math modelling that were conducted during this week proved the fact that children show a natural interest in mathematics at a young age, and it's important that we (both Teachers and Parents) should take advantage of this critical time in a child's education and build the foundation that will allow that interest and engagement to continue well into adulthood.



On 27/05/15, as part of the Math Week, the students had an interesting Math session with Mr. Sam Liew from INTI College. This talk was about the 'Power of the Hand' in Maths and taught students not



only the basic math concepts in an easy way by using fingers, but also enabled them to understand that math can be approached in a fun way too.

During the week, "Bake Sale for Charity" was organized where children volunteered to set up stalls and sold cupcakes, cookies, cake, brownies and a couple specialty items like "nut-free cookies" for those with allergies or special diets. The idea behind this was to make children

enjoy and practically learn more about 2D, 3D shapes and symmetry by baking cookies in different shapes and also understand the art of selling for a community cause.

On the final day, Parents showed eagerness to test their mathematical knowledge and application of mathematic principles by participating enthusiastically in activities like Math Maze and Math quiz. Mr. Ramesh Karnati, Head of Mathematics department presented the report on "The Math week" which highlighted the learning outcomes of this week followed by awarding the winners of this week.



Overall, the Math week was successful in bringing to the fore the potential abilities of all students. Indeed, the math skills that students learnt during this young age would definitely build a foundation for future learning endeavors and develop the ability to meet and overcome new challenges as they grow.

KMC is a unique competition that exposes students to interesting math problems which are designed by internationally renowned math educators and allows students to apply their knowledge in Mathematics. 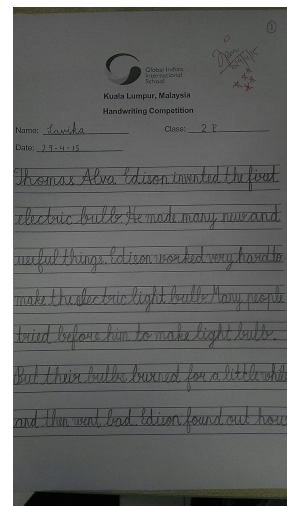

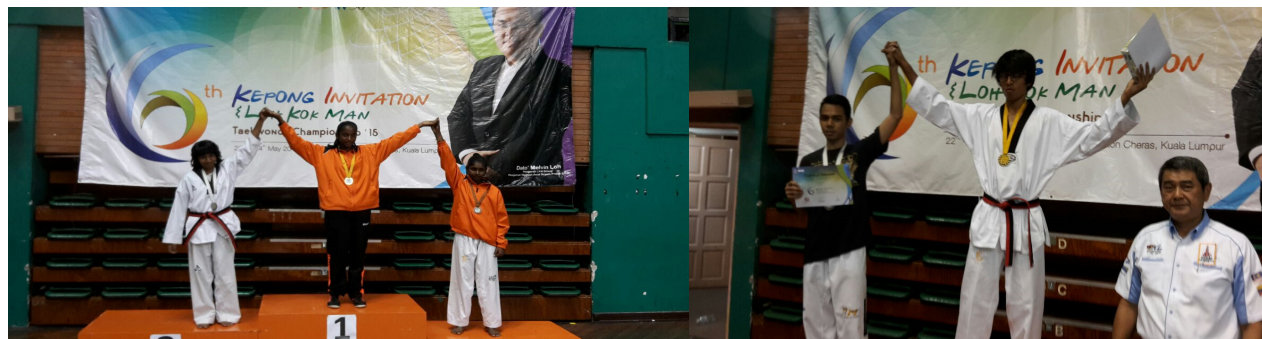


ISAKL BASKETBALL COMPETITION
