GIIS Queenstown Campus students and teachers paid their last respects to the late Mr Lee Kuan Yew at the Tanjong Pagar Community Club. Students presented their condolences to Mr Lee's family in the form of condolence cards and flowers. The students learnt about the late Mr Lee's contribution to Singapore through his personal recounts and viewed many photographs of him interacting with residents over the years.

Students and teachers of GIIS Queenstown (Primary) Campus organised a special event to honour Mr Lee. Students of classes 3 to 6 wrote special messages on 'post it' notes. A tribute board was put up with his image (at the centre) and the symbolic 'Red Box', which was used by Mr Lee as his briefcase. All the notes were pasted on the tribute board in such a way that it looked as if the messages were going into the 'Red Box.' "We displayed our wishes in a way that it resembled the 'Red Box' that belonged to Mr Lee – an iconic symbol of his dedication to Singapore. We also arranged for the candles to be displayed in the formation of 'LKY' – a name that is resonant with Singapore's transformation into a global city," said Surabhi Bansal, a student from Class 8 (IGCSE), GIIS Queenstown Campus. Students of classes 1 and 2 participated in a colouring activity to pay their tribute to Mr Lee.

Hand written messages of students were joined to form a long scroll of a combined length of 35 metres. These were split up and displayed by our students at different venues.


Print outs of orchid flowers which were distributed to our neighbours had touching thoughts penned down by them. They were displayed too.



### MM Lee launches book by Infosys founder Narayana Murthy

Channel News Asia 11 May 2009, Pearl Forss SINGAPORE: One of India's most prominent businessmen, Narayana Murthy, the founder of IT company Infosys, was in GIIS Queenstown Campus in Singapore to launch a book. He has said that the accountability of India's political system must be improved for the country to move forward. His comments came as the country is holding the world's largest democratic elections.

Mr Murthy believes the transparency and accountability of India's political system must be improved for the country to move forward. And these are some of the views detailed in his book titled "A Better India: A Better World", which was launched by Minister Mentor Lee Kuan Yew.

"Singapore is a real example of a country that has transformed herself from a third world country to a first world country in my own lifetime. All in, an environment of peace and harmony in a multi-cultural world. Singapore serves as a great example for all countries, both developing and developed. I'm so happy that my hero, Mr Lee Kuan Yew, is releasing the book here in Singapore," said Mr Murthy.

Mr Lee said: "There are limitations in the Indian constitutional system and the Indian political system that prevents it from going at high speed. I did not realise it until we engaged India closely. Whatever the political leadership may want to do, it must go through a very complex system at the centre, and then an even more complex system in the various states. The amount of work that is on the shoulders of these Ministers makes it necessary for each man, each Minister, to be like Mr Murthy. But Mr Murthy is a rare individual."

Mr Lee had told Mr Murthy previously that India needed political leaders like him. But Mr Murthy said he has no political ambition.
