### Inter House Competitions

#### HL: Spelling bee competition



A two-day Spelling Bee Competition for 2014-2015 was held in GIIS Kuala Lumpur (KL) Campus, Malaysia on July 22 and 23, 2014. Students of Classes 1 and 2 participated in this competition. The preliminary written round was conducted in the class. Students of Class 1 were given words such as 'language,' 'fairy-tale' and 'princess' to spell whereas the students of Class 2 had to spell words like, 'majesty', 'electrician' and 'Paediatrician.' Students who did well in preliminary rounds were qualified for the final round. The competition was judged by Ms Dhanya, a former teacher at GIIS KL Campus.

During the advance rounds of the competition, participants of Class 1 had to spell words orally such as 'international', 'question' and 'complete.' Krishay of Class 1D stood up to the tie-breaker challenge and spelt 'hippopotamus' without batting an eyelid. 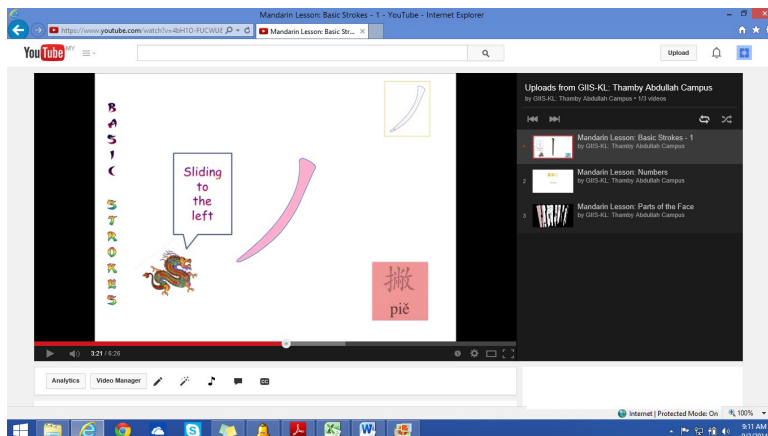
