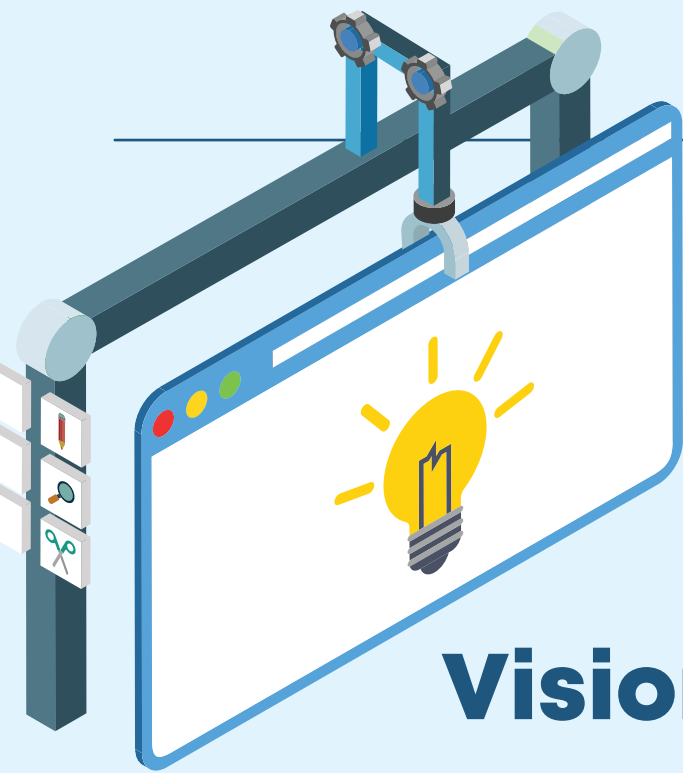

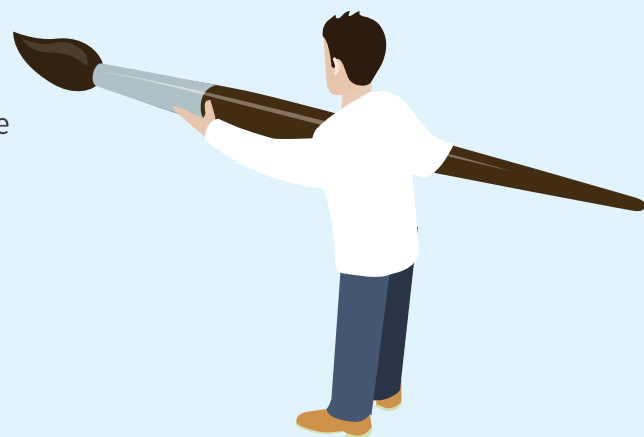

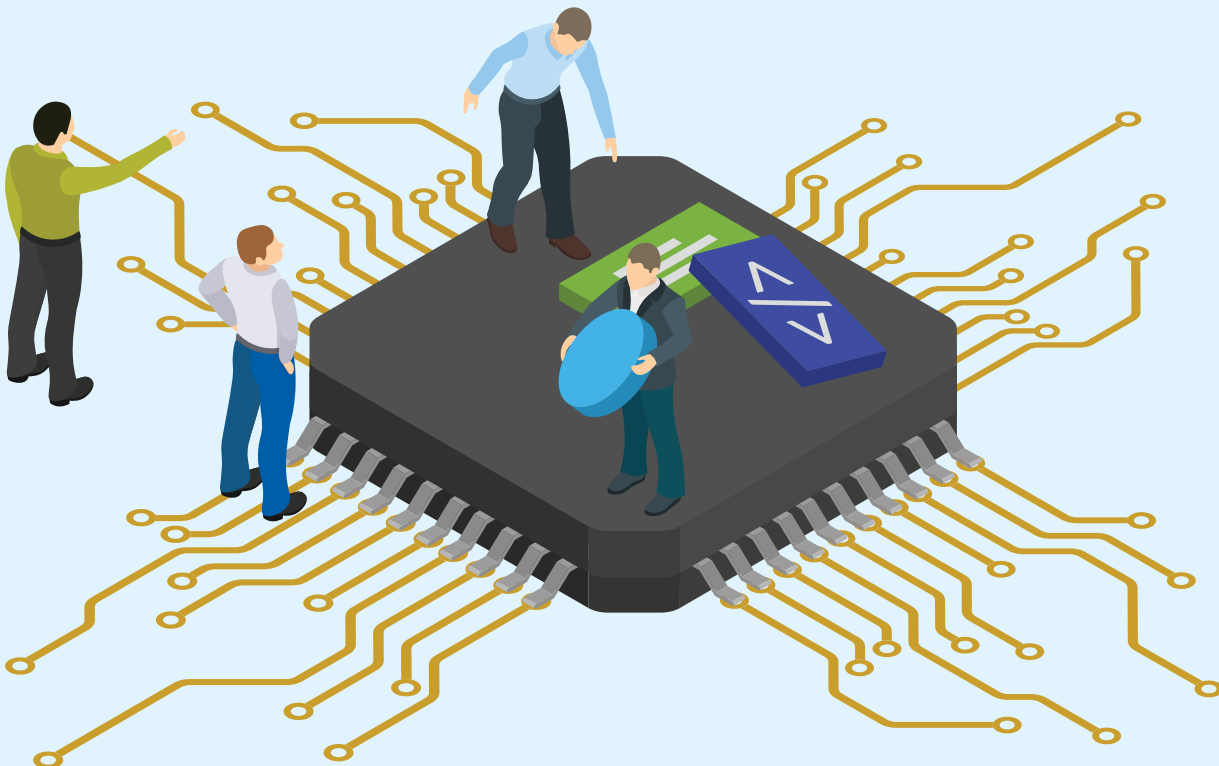

Relation between the teacher and the taught in 21st century. Are we reinventing the wheel?

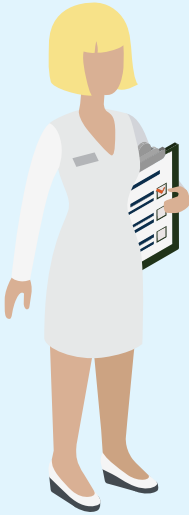
In the 20th century we witnessed mega changes in terms of scientific inventions, industrial revolutions, socio political changes which had silently changed the spectrum of learning at various levels. Various types of learning methods have been envisaged to name a few: Maria Montessori, Blooms Taxonomy etc., which have been influencing the learning to a large extent. These methods have led to mass pedagogies to cater to the needs of all levels of children through a highly structured curriculum and assessment methods?

However, something has been missing as we are looking forward for innovation in teaching and learning for 21st century. Of late the research has shown that Finnish education has proven to be the world's best education system. What is the secret behind its success?

Literal Meaning of the shloka:

- Line 1** May we both be Protected (the Teacher and the Student) (during the journey of awakening our Knowledge),
- Line 2** May we both be Nourished (with that spring of Knowledge which nourishes life when awakened),
- Line 3** May we Work Together with Energy and Vigour (cleansing ourselves with that flow of energy for the Knowledge to manifest),
- Line 4** May our Study be Enlightening (taking us towards the true Essence underlying everything), and not giving rise to Hostility (by constricting the understanding of the Essence in a particular manifestation only),
- Line 5** Om, Peace, Peace, Peace (be there in the three levels)

Particularly, I am fascinated by the line four of the shloka in which it talks about “constricting the learning about the essence in one particular way.” In 21st century where the teacher and the taught are infinitely surrounded by the information and technology, the learning process surfaces the question of teacher’s role. Thereof we may step into the ancient methods of learning where the teacher and the taught walk in the path of learning together and explore the knowledge and innovate for the future. Finnish education system is already walking this path of ancient method, where we will also be led by the technology to reach our vision of becoming a Global role model in teaching and learning.

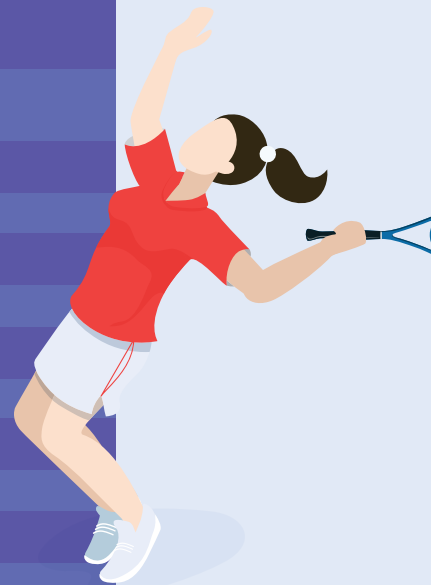

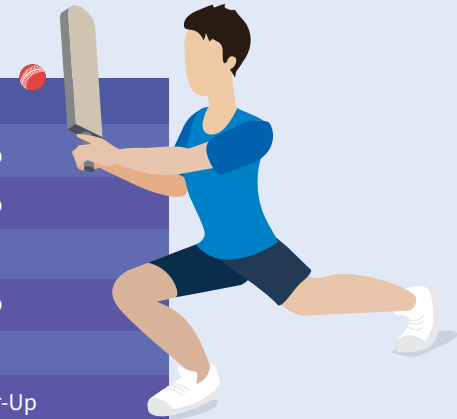

Campus Activities



Indian Cultural Fiesta 2017 (7 Apr)

GIIS-EC students participated in the Indian Cultural Fiesta 2017 conducted by Little India Shopkeepers & Heritage Association (LISHA) on 7 April through two performances. The first dance was a fusion of four classical dance forms in India including the Kathak, Odissi, Bharatanatyam and Manipuri. The second dance was a presentation of two bridal songs based on some of the rituals of a Bengali wedding ceremony. These spectacular dances were enjoyed by everyone around. The Guest of Honour who graced the event was Mr. Ng Chee Meng - Minister of Education (Schools) & Second Minister for Transport.



Kindergarten - Curriculum Familiarisation Morning (CFM) (25 Apr)

Kindergarten parents were invited for Curriculum Familiarisation Morning on 25 April for an overview of the Global Montessori Plus (GMP) Programme being offered at Kindergarten level. Ms. Mitali Chakravarty, a writer, poet and story-teller started the session with a talk on the 'significance and techniques of story-telling'. This was followed by a GMP presentation by the Kindergarten Co-ordinator Ms. Rema Rajiv, supported by kindergarten students. The session concluded with a talk on 'supporting your child's learning' by School Special Educator Ms. Melissa Conceicao.



Earth Day Celebrations (21 Apr)

Students of Classes 1 and 2 participated in the preliminary round prior to the Earth Day celebration at the Queenstown Campus. They came dressed in clothes made from out of recycled material, and spoke about the thought behind their costumes as well as about the importance of the 3Rs — reduce, reuse and recycle — in today's world.

On 21 April, the entire school celebrated Earth Day by taking the Earth Day pledge, as well as engaging in interesting activities such as a marble painting, having a Green Party, kite making using recycled materials, and holding a Special Assembly which included programmes like — a skit and dance, miming, presentations, etc, thereby demonstrating support for environmental protection.

Mother's Day Celebrations @ EC (5 May)

Mother's Day was celebrated with great fervour and enthusiasm at GIIS-EC campus on 5 May. Various competitions were organised for them - portrait making, face painting and salad making etc. A contest called 'How much do you know your mom?' was held, where students were questioned on the likes and dislikes of their mothers. The 'Mother's Cricket Match' saw enthusiastic participation from mothers. A mass activity was organised for the students, teachers and parents where everybody had to write a short message for their mothers on a small, heart-shaped card. This activity was conducted in collaboration with Jemiyah Home for the Aged, and was aimed at making the largest chain of messages for mothers.



WWF Activities

Environmental Patrol & Clean Up Workshop (5 Apr)

GIIS-EC students of Classes 6 and 7 attended a workshop conducted by WWF on Environmental Patrol & Clean Up on 5 April. They discussed about marine conservation through waste management. They were taught about how marine life has been affected due to human activities through a short story video on 'Winnie the Fish'. They were shown the importance of 3R's (reduce, reuse, recycle) and how to keep the water bodies free from litter. Later, they engaged in hands-on activities as they collected trash discarded on Kallang riverside. To emphasize on 3R's, the students were asked to make a pen stand using recycled plastic boxes. WWF concluded the session by conducting a quiz on the workshop. On 24 May, the students of Class 8 CBSE attended a beach clean-up activity at Sembawang Park conducted by World Wildlife Fund (WWF).



WWF 'Into the Wild' Exhibition & Workshop (19 Jul)

On 19 July, the Green Ambassadors from Classes 7 & 8 attended the WWF 'Into the Wild' Exhibition & Workshop at Art and Science Museum. It started with an insight into a real-world difference using Tango, a cutting-edge technology by Google at the museum's latest permanent development, Into the Wild: An Immersive Virtual Adventure. Immersed in a digital world, students encountered some of the key inhabitants of the Southeast Asian rainforest — pangolins, tapirs, mousedeer, orangutans and tigers. They observed the animals in their natural habitat and learnt about the imminent dangers faced by these animals.

Later, students attended the workshop on 'The Art of Storyboard', where they learnt about shot sizes and angles. They were provided time to create their own story which they shared during the workshop. At the end of the session, students were given the task of making a presentation on the assigned animal using digital technology and submit it by September. Winning entries will be displayed in the exhibition organised by WWF in November.

School Awards (GSA) Ceremony for Classes 3-8 CBSEi and 8 IGCSE was conducted on 12 May to felicitate the students who had performed exceedingly well in all fields in school ranging from academics to co-curricular to sports. 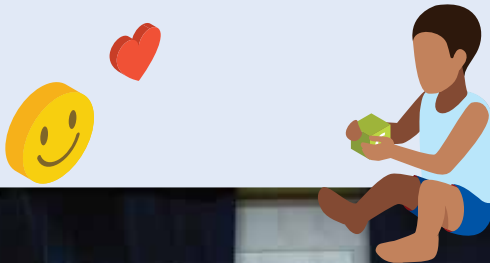

Sony Creative Toy Making Competition (3 Aug)

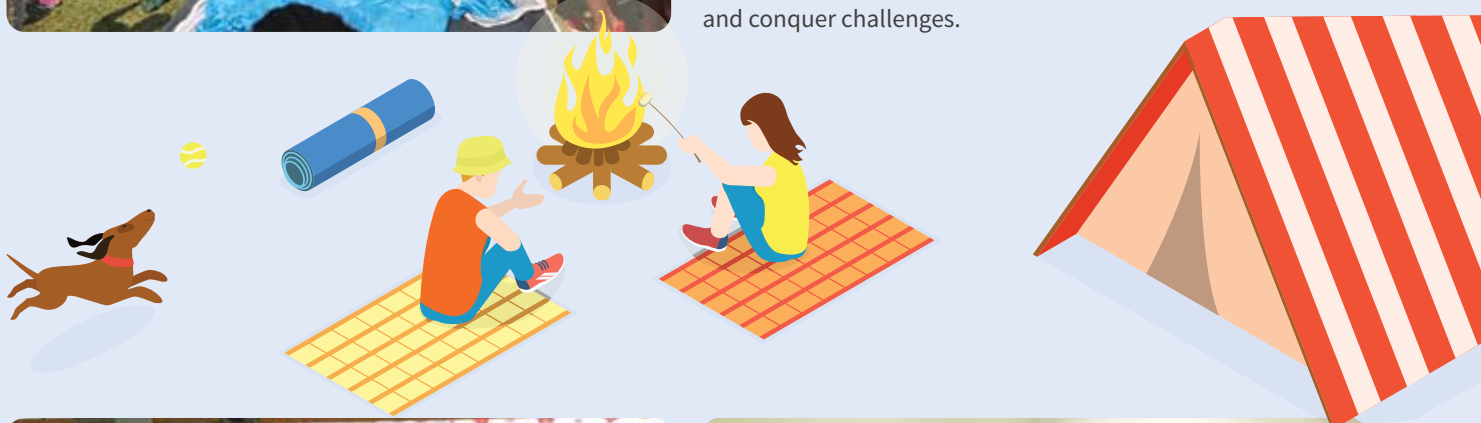

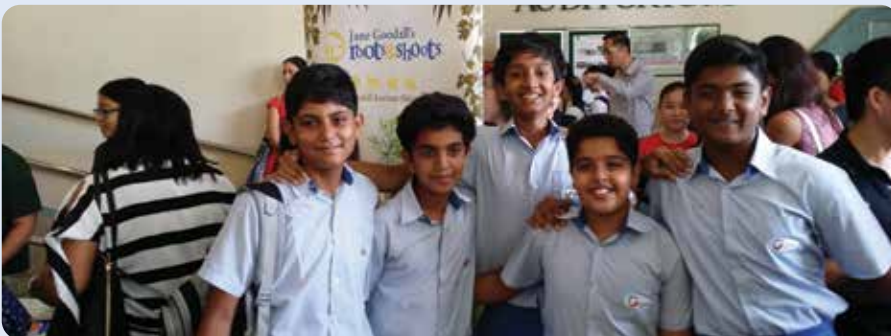
Learning Journey to Peranakan Museum (17 Aug)

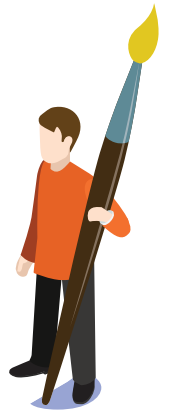

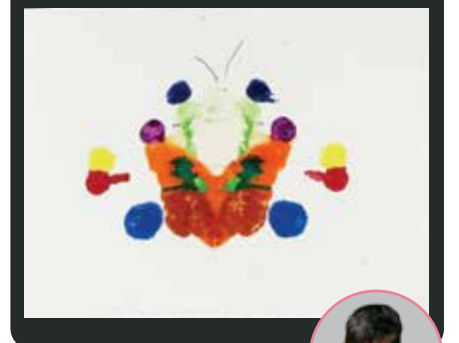

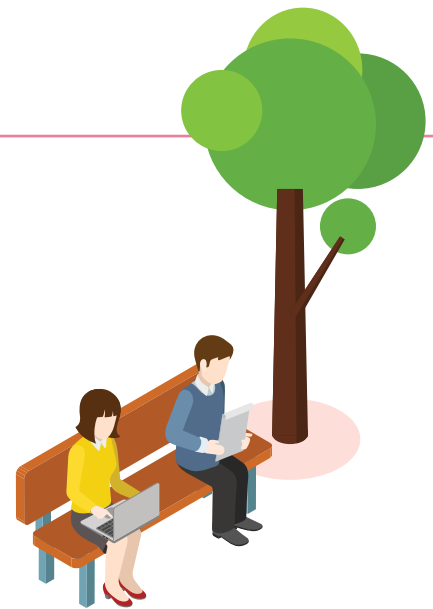

Be Satisfied

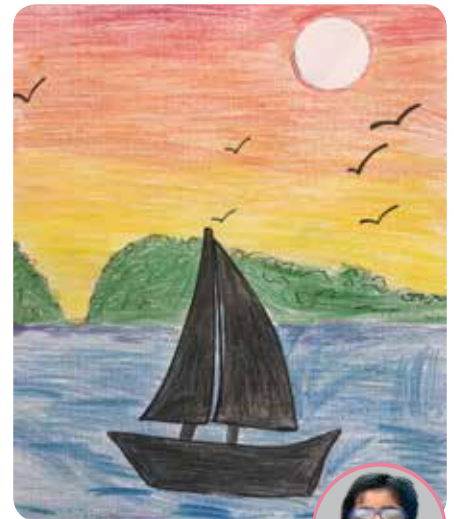
Once a meeting of animals was going on in the forest. Everyone was feeling happy and comfortable.
