Active lifelong learning

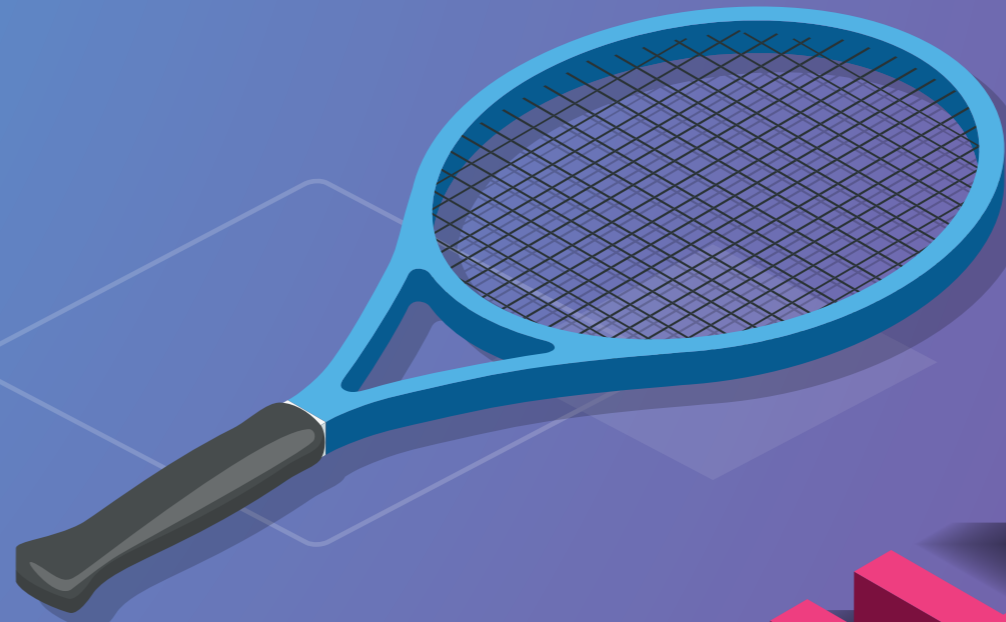

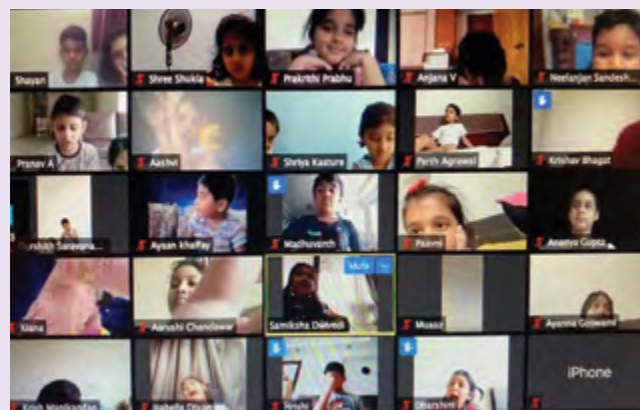
23rd April 2020 World Book Day

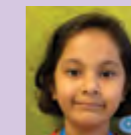
My Trip to the Natural History Museum, Singapore

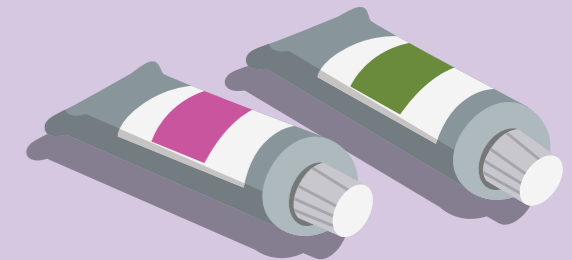
BACK TO SCHOOL IN COVID TIMES

Such fun craft activities are designed to help children to express themselves and at the same time, increases their dexterity and helps develop self-confidence.

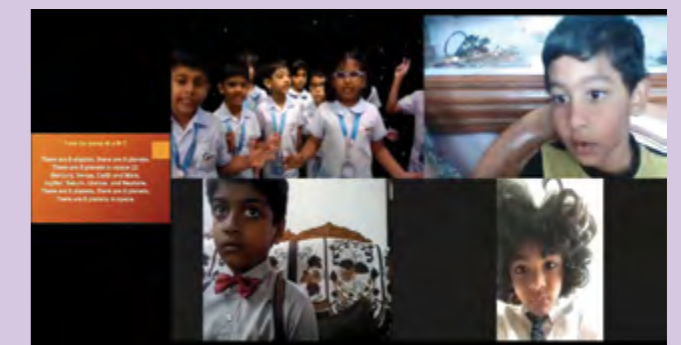
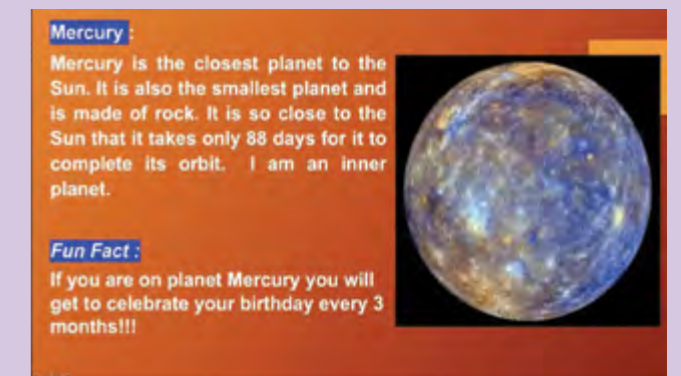
**15th February 2021
