The past, present, and future are what matters a lot in one's own life. The experiences allow us to take a peek at ourselves, give us a chance to see our strengths, weaknesses and what we are really capable of. Life is not a straight line that goes from point A to point B. It is a journey of self-discovery and creation. Life is transformative. Sometimes feeling lost may be normal. What's important, however, is that "being lost" should not become an excuse for self-stagnation.

If you are waiting for someone to give you the green light to get started on designing the life you want, you'll be waiting forever. Give yourself a little push and keep going. A job well started is half the job done!

This push or impetus can come with self-awareness. That is one of the most powerful personal development tools in one's arsenal. Ask yourself questions. Difficult ones. Digital Pedagogy is the Way Forward for GIIS

Digital pedagogy is the study and use of contemporary digital technology in teaching and learning. It can be applied in a variety of learning environments including face-to-face, online or Blended. At GIIS, we adapted this new pedagogical approach to counter the effects of Covid-19 related lockdowns. This transition was so successfully embedded in teaching content, teaching style and assessments, that we see a new flourish in student learning.

So how exactly does digital pedagogy enhance student learning?

We all know that the approaches to learning rest on the principles of developed thinking, social skills, communication skills, research skills and self-management. These are taught in six ways: through inquiry-based learning, focus on concepts, contextual learning, collaborative learning, differentiation and information through assessment.

Digital pedagogy blends these approaches through latest platforms and state-of-the-art infrastructure, which makes it easier for teachers and students to meet their individual goals in teaching and learning. In the long run, it has eliminated external challenges to educational continuity, making it smooth and fruitful.

We were always aware of the positive effects of digital pedagogy, but the concept was expedited with the onset of the pandemic. Blended learning was embraced wholeheartedly, which involved both online and face-to-face instructions, sometimes in a single classroom. The two modes complemented each other to create

an environment of deeper learning for students within the ecosystem of balanced and holistic approach of GIIS 9GEMS.

Through Blended Learning, students were able to integrate technology to teach, modify techniques for student benefit and use data analytics to overcome learning deficits. Course plans were chalked for subjects which suggest teaching sequences and in-classroom activities. Teachers were given guides to enhance their own knowledge, and in turn provide proper guidance to students' technological needs. E-exams and online assessments added to the mix for a faster application and result.

All this has led to two things:

Teachers have implemented digital pedagogical approaches to meet learning outcomes, help students gain a deeper understanding of subjects and apply this learning to their own social lives.

Students are using digital pedagogical approaches alongside 9GEMS - GIIS learning framework - to be SMART, and to apply SMAR (Substitution, Modification, Augmentation, Redefinition) with Technology.

Add this to the provision of online learning platforms, well-established learning management systems, tools, apps and student service centres, and we find ourselves all set to enable learners with enough skills to meet the needs of the 21st century. They are clearly emerging as winners in face of rapidly evolving economies across the globe.

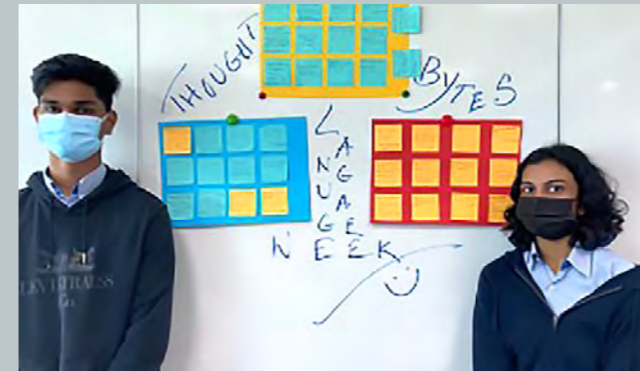
A Memorable Experience: Leadership Lecture Series with Ms Ritu Phogat

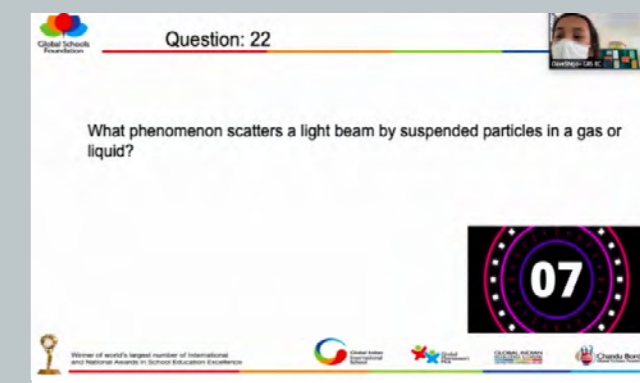
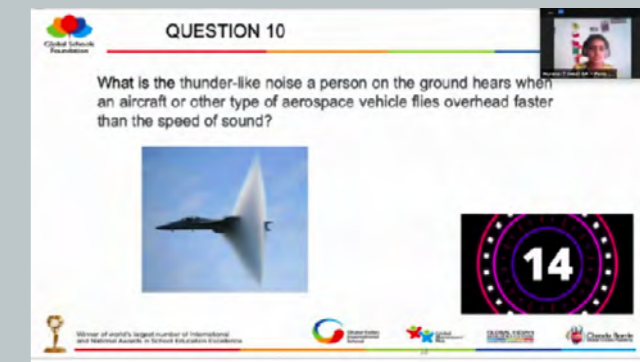


28th July 2021 Innovation-packed Creators' Summit 2021

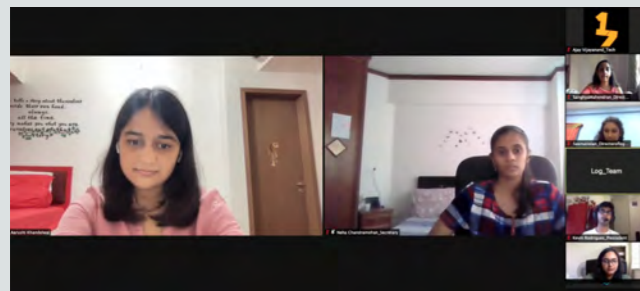
28th July 2021 Brightest Minds Competed at the Virtual Science HiQ Quiz

The event went off without a hitch, with positive feedback from all mathematics instructors and participants. The GIIS Mathematics Club hopes to host more events like this in the future.

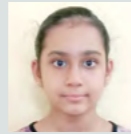

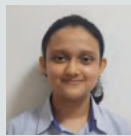

The Cookie Thief

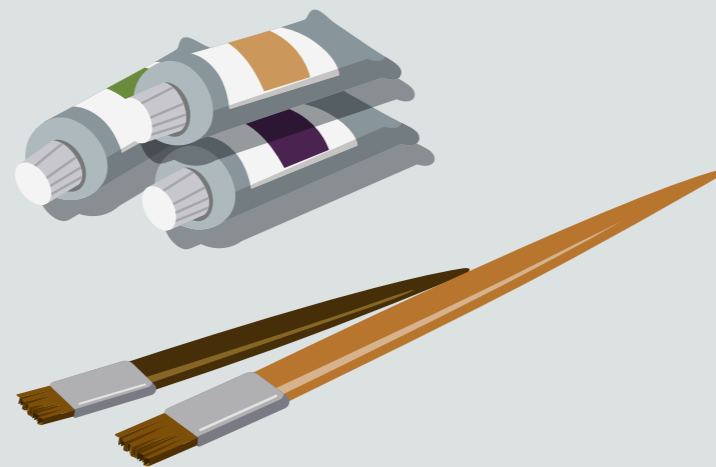

And what was "Normal" anyway?

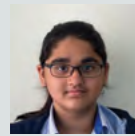

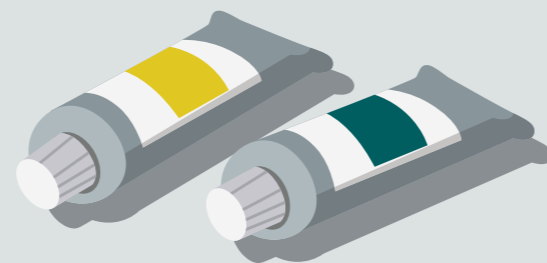

Je m'appelle Afifa et je suis fier de dire que je combats le cancer depuis 5 à 6 ans.

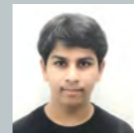

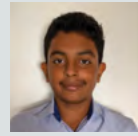

Wormholes - Interdimensional Wonders

For most people teleportation is a dream, fantasy, and fiction. But what if we could do something similar, something that enables us to get from one place to another faster than the speed of light. Many space-times allow interstellar travel, which is allowed by general relativity. One of these is the Einstein-Rosen bridge or more commonly known as a wormhole. This was a theory proposed by Nathan Rosen and Albert Einstein in 1935. Our universe is just like a big flat sheet of cloth. Bent in just the right way, wormholes could connect two very distant places in the universe with a short bridge which you could cross instantaneously, faster than the speed of light! Einstein-Rosen bridges are like black holes that, in simple words, are like a portal that connects to an infinite parallel universe. Space-time is flat but bent by the gravity of other objects. If we keep reducing the size of the celestial body, it will be caused to collapse creating a black hole with a singularity in the middle that sucks everything in but does not allow anything to escape. Maybe, just maybe, the singularity could function as a wormhole connecting our side of the universe to the infinite parallel dimension where time works differently. So instead of sucking everything in it spews everything out as time here moves backward. This "black hole" spewing everything out is called a white hole. The second theory is called the cosmic string theory. This theory states that our universe contains a series of cosmic "strings" that already function as a wormhole. Shortly after the Big Bang (a zeptosecond), there were many space-time quantum fluctuations at the smallest scale, even smaller than atoms- Planck length

(10-35m) that may have created many wormholes around the universe. These wormholes were created in the form of cosmic strings and as the universe expanded the ends of these were pulled further and further away from each other causing them to be moved light-years away. Some physicists believe that the massive black holes in the middle of the Milky Way could be wormholes too. But there is an equally hard way to get our hands on a wormhole- why don't we just make one. Well, it is possible if there are a few properties we have to keep in mind. First of all, it should connect two places in the universe. Second, it should not have a lot of pressure, or else anything that goes through could be as well as dead. But here comes the biggest problem. When a wormhole is opened gravity exerts so much pressure that it forces the wormhole to collapse from the centre to form a black hole. Therefore, we need something to help keep the wormhole open. A celestial body that does the opposite of exerting pressure something like exotic matter. The exotic matter will push everything outward. It is not like ordinary matter or antimatter. It can be found in the centre of neutron stars and can help open a wormhole. While it may sound simple exotic matter is not exactly extractable because we do not have the technology to do so. But maybe shortly we can colonize other planets and celestial bodies and become a type 1 civilization. Crossing galaxies just by moving through a portal, sounds amazing, doesn't it?

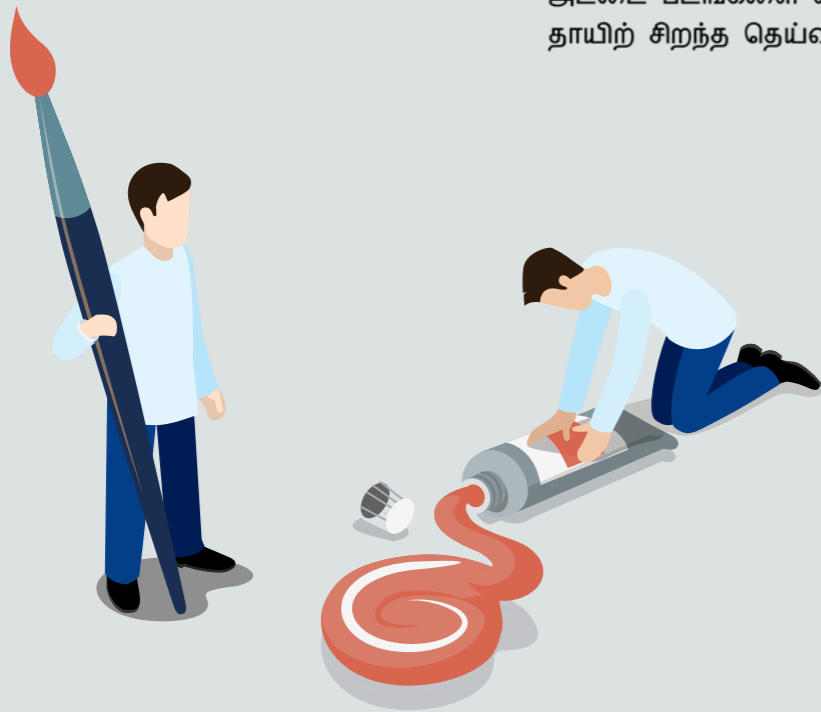

behind bars

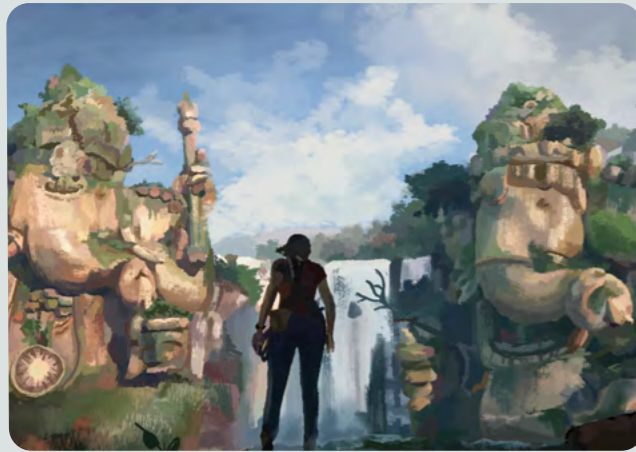
Clutching his sack with shivering hands

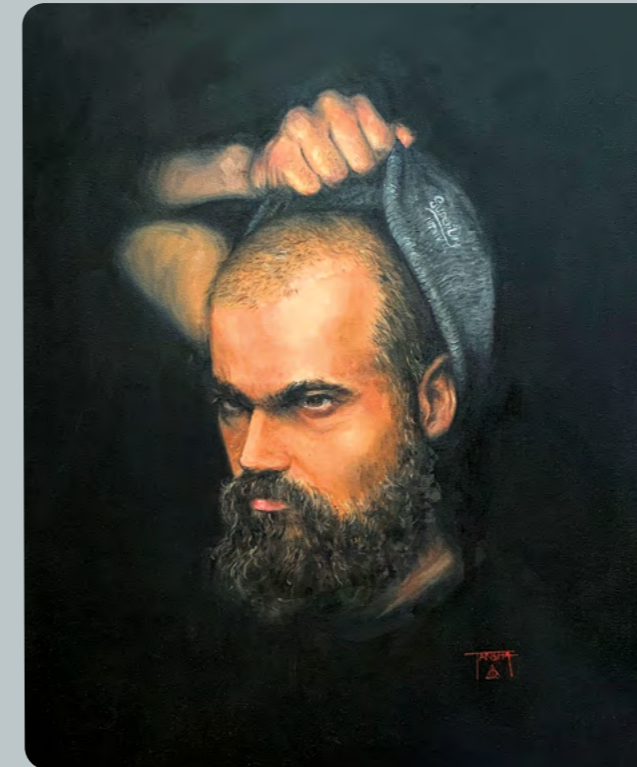

6th Generation computers - The Metaverse

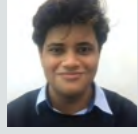

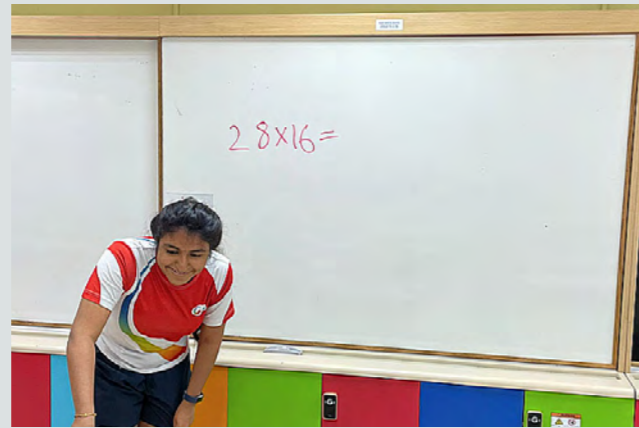
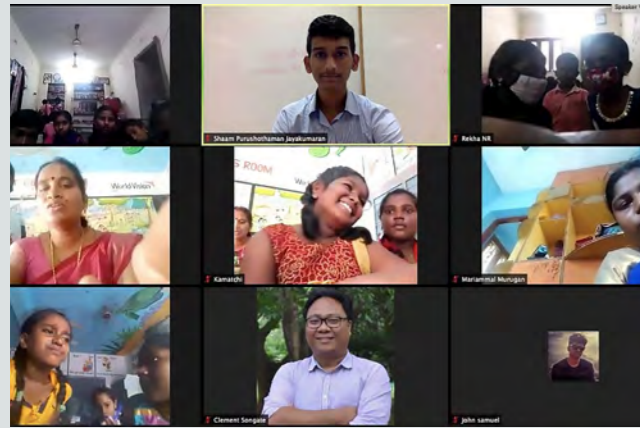


23rd - 27th September 2020 PROJECT SMILE: Rendering a Smile to Unknown Faces

PROJECT SMILE, a Singapore-based charity, and our school cooperated to promote the attitude of giving and sharing by hosting an exhibition on our campus to sell PROJECT SMILE's charity items. Students Omkar Sankar, Prarthak Sharma, Sainath Ananthalingam, Divyansh Tomar, and volunteers Ruchir Choudhary and Abhishek Prasad hosted this exhibition.

Project Smile, a volunteer-led group started in 2010, focuses on supporting women from low-income households, single parents, and those dealing with mental health issues. They provide a variety of skill training programs in areas such as art, sewing, cooking, and others to give participants a sense of accomplishment and enable them to earn a living on their own. They also increase their confidence by providing financial support and coaching if needed. Over 100 families have received their services thus far, and they intend to help many more.

The exhibition was a huge success, with \$1400 in sales and roughly 150 products ranging in price from \$3 to \$60. Masks, candles, and ornate boxes were among the goods created by PROJECT SMILE participants. Furthermore, students and teachers purchased various things manufactured by the beneficiaries. The proceeds from the sale of the items went to PROJECT SMILE's beneficiaries.



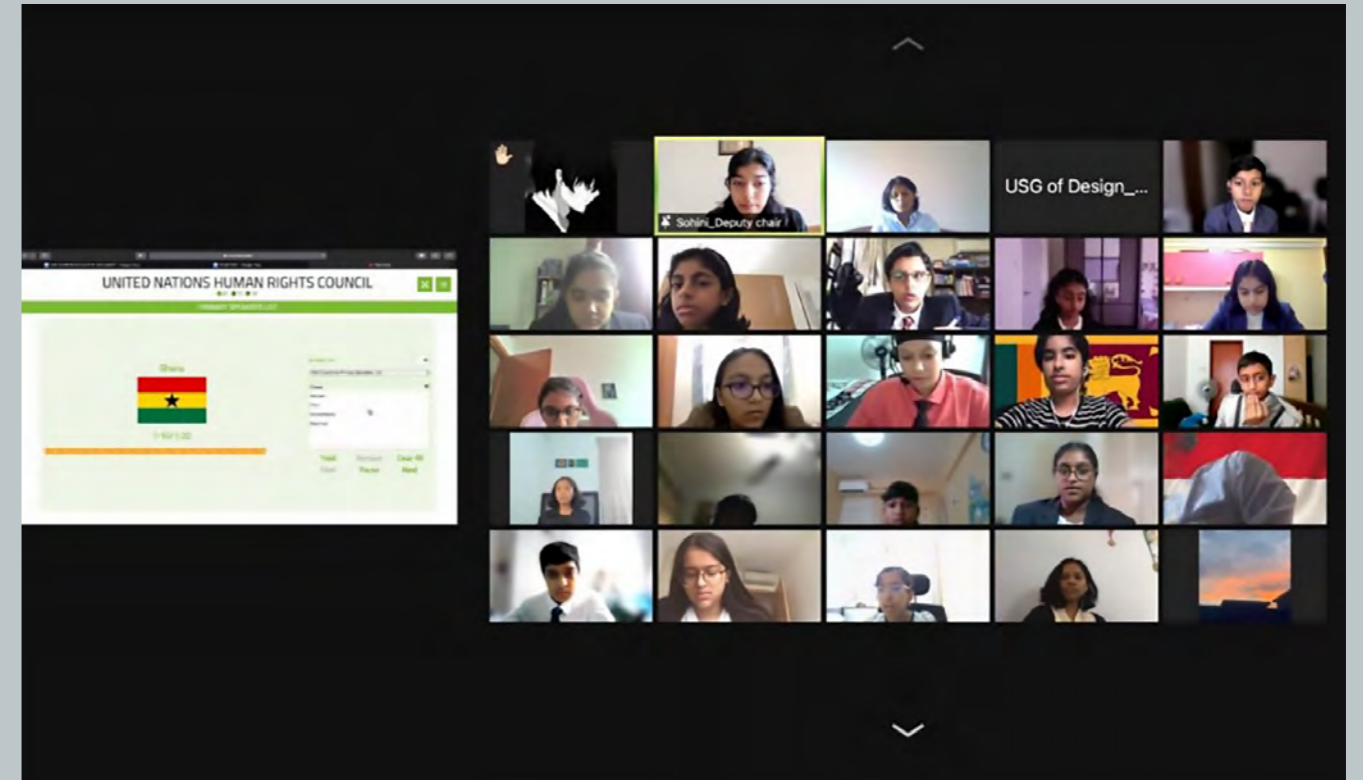
**30th August 2021
The World Vision Programme: Offering Education to Underprivileged Children**

'Education is the most potent weapon you can employ to change the world', South African leader Nelson Mandela once said. In this spirit, we collaborated with the World Vision Foundation and launched the World Vision Programme to provide quality education to underprivileged children across India. The program was restarted in August 2021 after a hugely successful first run in 2020.

Students from Grade 11 participated in the programme which covered lectures in basic English and Mathematics for the underprivileged kids, with a special focus on practical applications which can give them a leg up in the real world.

As many as 100 students registered for the project, 40 more than the previous year. This year the programme also extended to 18 locations in five cities of Kanpur, Gurgaon, Delhi, Agra and Chennai, as compared to last year when only Agra and Chennai were included. As a result, almost 500 students in India benefitted, with sessions held in English, Hindi, or Tamil.

While teaching last year, the program also provided students with crucial soft skills, including patience and coherence and cross-cultural interaction with their Indian counterparts. The school's aim was to give our students the opportunity to be leaders in the field, by taking up responsibilities that can benefit society as a whole.



**21st - 22nd September 2021
Creating a Model United Nations' Simulation with GIIS CONFERENCE 2021**

Students hosted the GIIS Conference, along the lines of Model United Nations, with a goal of bringing together young people to debate today's most pressing global issues. It was aimed at students from Grades 6 to 8 and served as a forum to improve their public speaking, research, and critical thinking skills.

Nine different crises committees and three press agencies were staged at the GIIS Conference 2021, which was conducted under the leadership of acting principal Ms Sheeja KP, and Saransh Srivastava, the Secretary-General of the conference.

The committees included UNHRC (United Nations Human Rights Council), IAEA (International Atomic Energy Agency), DISEC (Disarmament and International Security Council), UNODC (United Nations Office of Drugs and Crime), USS (United States Senate), HNATO (Historical North Atlantic Treaty Organization), JCC (Joint Crisis Committee).

Singapore Morning Post, South China Morning Post, and CNN were present as the media. Around 150 delegates engaged in lively debate and sought to resolve their objectives over two days. They also engaged in heated argument sessions, driven by dramatic crises and news conferences.

Finally, the delegates who had demonstrated the most promise throughout the meeting received awards. Vianca Gupta and Jivika Bhat, the Director-General and Deputy Secretary-General, respectively, delivered moving speeches at the ceremony's close.



21st - 30th September 2021 Focussing on Physical Well-being of Students with Virtual Sports Challenge 2021

In September, the Virtual Sports Challenge 2021 was held to encourage students to participate in physical activity and build a competitive spirit. The event was available to children in grades 6 through 12 and provided a fantastic opportunity to participate and socialise with their peers.

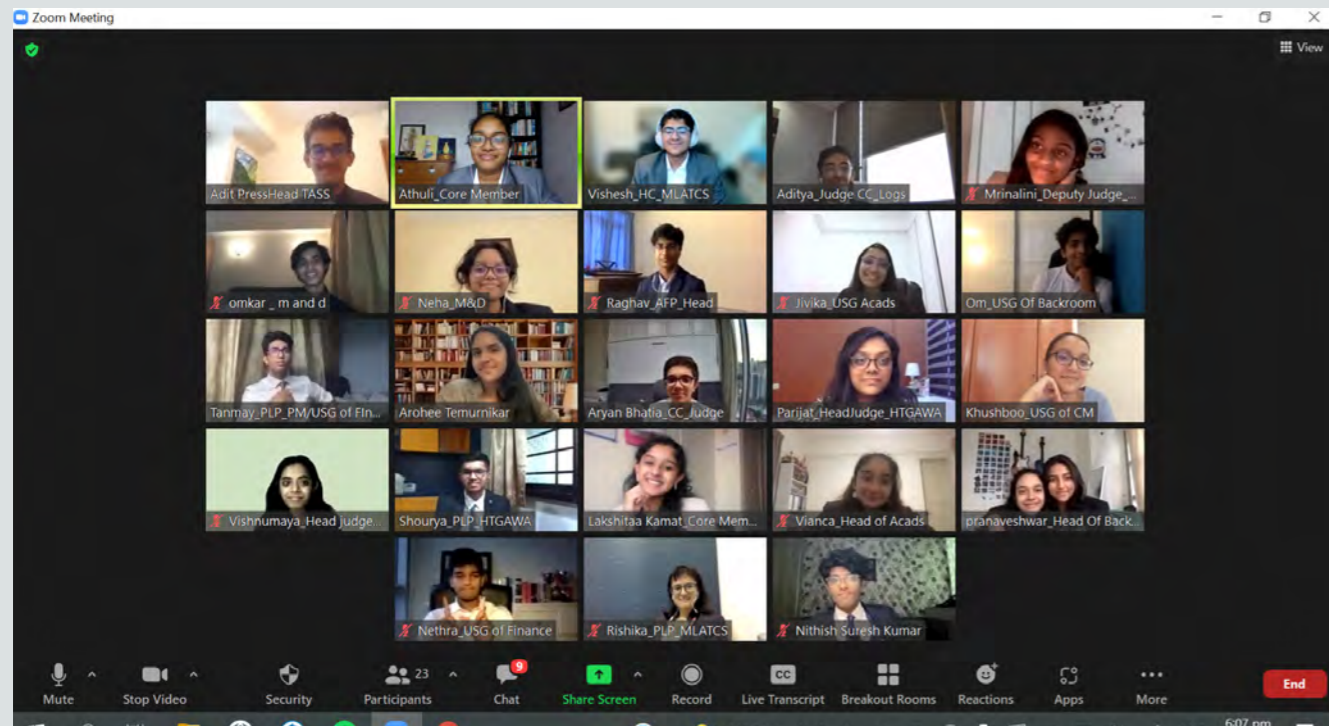

Students from CBSE grade 12 and IB Year 2 had organised the event. The TEDx event this year was a huge success.





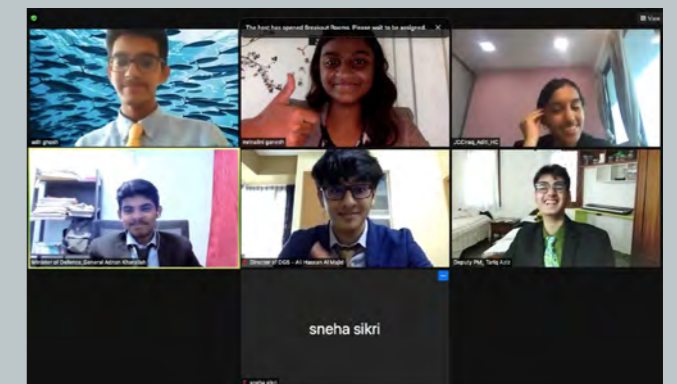
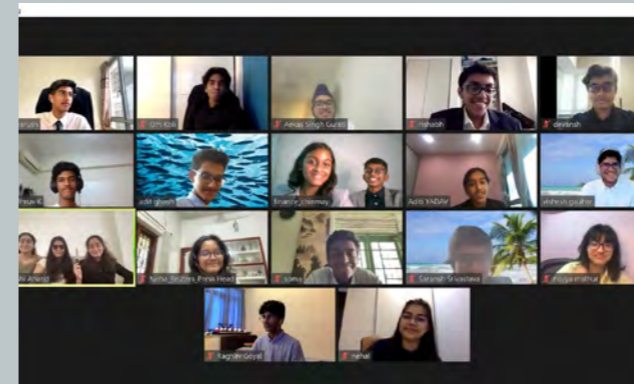
**19th - 21st November 2021
